

#### **KEY FINDINGS: THE NEED FOR ACTION AT SCALE**







675 companies that produce or source palm oil, timber products, cattle products, soy, natural rubber, cocoa, or coffee

2/3 of companies have a policy related to deforestation

2/3 of companies engage direct suppliers to manage deforestation risks

3/4 of companies have a traceability system for at least one commodity

2/3 of companies use certification for some of their commodity volumes



1/3 have public company-wide no-deforestation or no-conversion policies



1/4 provide technical or financial assistance to direct suppliers



1/4 of companies have sufficient traceability or monitoring systems to implement commitments made or assess progress against them



Only 7% report that >90% of one commodity is certified by a scheme that provides assurance of no-deforestation/no-conversion








Target date = date by which companies intend to have fully implemented commitments

- 205 companies with 330 commodityspecific commitments
- 92% of those include target dates



Cutoff date = point in time after which deforestation or conversion renders commodities produced on the converted land non-compliant with commitments




74% of commitments included a cutoff date of 2020 or earlier

#### **INSIDE THE REPORT: TRACEABILITY**







For each commodity, up to 20% of companies can trace half their volumes to point of origin


For some commodities, companies have traceability to a processing facility or municipality

Across all commodities, many companies cannot trace half their volumes past the level of a country or first subnational jurisdiction

#### INSIDE THE REPORT: MONITORING







Of 247 companies with a company-wide no-deforestation/conversion policy or commitment

72% report having a monitoring system related to those policies/commitment.



### INSIDE THE REPORT: MANAGING SUPPLIER NON-COMPLIANCE



242 companies responded to questions about responses to supplier non-compliance with no-deforestation/no-conversion policies

Response to non- compliance	% of responding companies
Retain and engage	65%
Suspend and engage	46%
Exclude	37%

#### What is engagement?

Providing information on actions that can be taken to address non-compliance

Developing timebound targets to bring suppliers into compliance

Re-integrating suppliers based on successful completion of those implementation plans
